What is our Purpose and Mission?

As we enter the natural season of Summer, we as the People of God, the Church, enter the Season of the Church, six months of Sundays after the great Day of Pentecost when Peter and the others experienced the risen Lord, and when they were set on fire by the Holy Spirit in Jerusalem. Fifty days after Easter, the real work began, God's work, our hands and feet and voices.

"The baptized devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and common life, to the breaking of bread and the prayers. Awe came upon everyone, because many wonders and signs were being done by the apostles. All who believed were together and had all things in common; they would sell their possessions and goods and distribute the proceeds to all as any had need. Day by day, as they spent much time together in the temple, they broke bread at home and ate their food with glad and generous hearts, praising God and having the goodwill of all the people. And day by day the Lord added to their number those who were being saved."

Acts 2:42-47 NRSV

And so from doubt and fear to joy and new life, those first Christians worshipped and prayed together, in community, they shared the Holy Communion and fellowshipped with one another. They taught and learned the scriptures, and they shared time and possessions with any who had needs. 


