Our May meeting was held Friday morning May 17th. We read through our purpose statement and the areas of emphasis that Churchwide had designated during the 2017 triennial.

Our purpose statement reads: As a community of women created in the image of God, called to discipleship in Jesus Christ, and empowered by the Holy Spirit, we commit ourselves to grow in faith, affirm our gifts,

support one another in our callings, engage in ministry and action, and promote healing and wholeness in the church, the society, and the world.

We felt we were engaging in ministry and action, but maybe needed to do more in the growing in faith part. As a result we are hoping to do a Breakfast Bible Study (we talked about holding this at Perkins) this summer using the summer study from WELCA's Gather magazine. Our discussion of the three areas of emphasis were really interesting. These areas are:

- Affirm the need for clean and potable water and be encouraged to act upon it by raising awareness and /or offering tangible support to the people of Flint, Michigan.
- Support the United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child by stating clearly that it condemns all forms of corporal punishment of children.
- Recognize domestic abuse and violence as a serious issue in our communities and our churches; and that Women of the ELCA educate themselves about the signs of domestic abuse and violence and the services available in the community

Becky Praster shared her experiences living in developing countries and Bonne Pyne de Portillo shared her experiences as a medical volunteer in Honduras. They both said we in this country have no idea what the rest of the world is like.

During our very brief business meeting, we decided to have our traditional luncheon at the Olive Garden on Monday June 10th – for those who wish to carpool, we will meet at the church at 12:30. For those who wish to go directly to Olive Garden, be there by 1:00. The Olive Garden is off route 248 in Easton; address is 50 Kunkle Dr, Easton, PA 18045.



Food ministry: Thanks to everyone who donated women's personal care items and food in May.
