#### "Easter is Forever"

#### Christ is risen! He is risen indeed! Alleluia!

And Jesus is not just risen one Sunday, nearly 2000 years ago. And he is not just risen on April 21, when we observed Easter Day in 2019. For us, who confess our Easter Faith as Christians, "He is risen forever." Our lives have been changed. The world has been changed.

In fact, the Christian Church does not just mark one day or one week for Easter each year, but 50 days and seven Sundays. We will be shouting "Alleluia" and waving "Alleluias" into June. During this time, we will ask, with the help of the New Testament, a series of powerful questions. How do we know God? How can we be sure God is still with us, after the resurrection and before Christ comes again?

Well, we know God through the embodied love of Jesus: His forgiveness, peace, body and blood. And we are assured that God is still with us through the Spirit.

To help us with these questions, the Scriptures tell us a series of Resurrection Stories to increase our faith in the risen Christ:

- "Peace" announced by Jesus twice to a locked room of disciples
- A Fish Breakfast and declaration of love
- A story about sheep and the Good Shepherd
- Jesus' giving his disciples then and now a new commandment
- Jesus and his Father's promise never to let us go.

We get to hear over and over again the amazing significance of the Resurrection. And we are assured that because God always loves us, we also can love. Don't miss a single week of the Easter Season! Your life and your faith will be enriched here in a faith community of Easter brothers and sisters.




### **EASTER EGG HUNT THANK YOU!!!**
