Every year, the Church is given 40 days of Lent to grow in faith - to be more deeply connected to God and to each other. Beginning with Ash Wednesday, special worship, prayer, devotional, and educational opportunities are available to us here in the congregation and with neighboring congregations,

For 40 days, including the month of March, we have the opportunity to accept and give thanks for God's amazing grace, especially through the life and death of Christ our Savior. On Good Friday, April 10, ELC of Durham will host a special worship service at 7 PM, focusing on Christ's amazing act of love for the world on the cross.

Highlights of the Annual Congregational Meeting held on 2/23/2020

- Minutes from the previous year and the Financial Report for 2019 were all approved.
- Elections Mark Harwick, Scott Gaun, and Val McGinn were re-elected to a 2nd 3-year term on Church Council. Matthew Mueller was elected to a 2nd 1-year term as Youth Council Member. Ken Anderson and Becky Praster were elected as voting members to the 2020 Synod Assembly on May 1 and 2.
- Congregational President Scott Gaun set goals for the new year to address the need to paint and install new windows on the outside of the church, and to follow up on the results of the 2018 MAPS survey.
- Pastor David Deal introduced the start of new teams to get involved in Worship, Education, Property, Youth, etc. in anticipation of his retirement at the end of 2021.
- Kudos were given to Mark Harwick for his work in organizing the installation of our new church doors, and to Ken Anderson, who has worked with the Finance Committee on developing a new system.



February Meeting: We had a long business meeting reviewing our January Soup Supper and planning our February Soup Supper. As part of our devotions we wrote some encouraging notes to members of our congregation; this led into a discussion of the length of the prayer list. We did not work with our old minute books, but will at a later date. Lynn Gaun took them home with her; and hopes to have our help writing a
