Proclamation of the Birth of Christ

was born of the virgin Mary in Bethlehem of Judea.

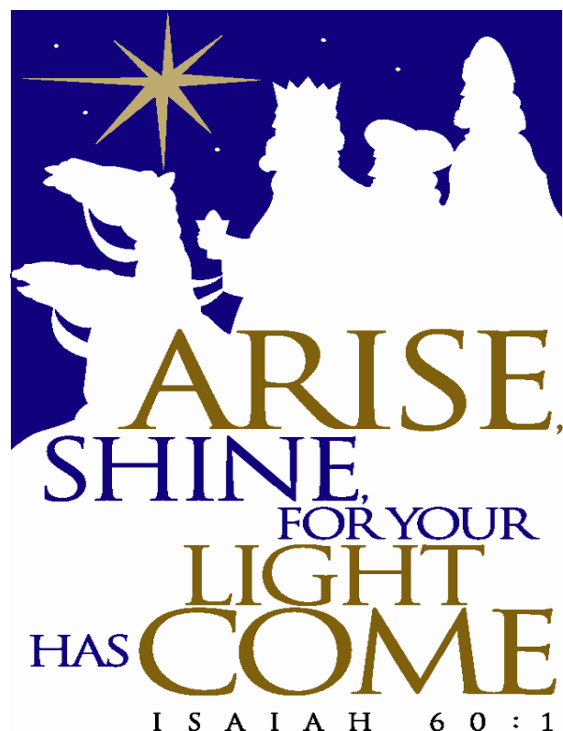
