PEOPLE: We give thanks to God for the privilege of being able to confront the evil of hunger through participating in this CROP Hunger Walk.

LEADER: We walk to accompany those whose daily lives are ones of survival, struggle and accomplishment, knowing that all people prefer to live lives of dignity, as all are created in God’s image.

PEOPLE: We acknowledge that our efforts alone will not end hunger, but as members of this community, we are saying yes to hope, and yes to walking as partners united in a vision that there is enough for all.

LEADER: We walk by faith: faith in God who created us, faith in the ministry of CWS that our financial and in-kind contributions will be received as both gift and as our acknowledgment that ending hunger is a goal worthy of the One who gives life to all.

PEOPLE: We are a privileged people because we live to serve others, even as we are enriched by our symbolic walking with those near and far away who, like us, live as children of God, and strive for a world without hunger.

ALL: Gracious God, on this day and the days to come, unite us as we walk with one another, give us perseverance in confronting hunger, and wisdom to persuade our elected officials to craft legislation that will better serve the needs of hungry and oppressed people throughout the world.
