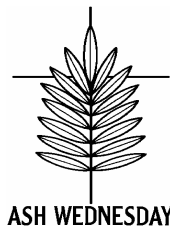

ASH WEDNESDAY

ASH WEDNESDAY is the first day of Lent, the forty-day season that focuses on the story of Jesus' passion and death. It is more than a simple changing of seasons; it signals a change of heart. We acknowledge our passage from death to life. We recognize that we are truly dust, and receive the ashes of Lent. We affirm that we live because of a death—the death and resurrection of our Lord, Jesus Christ, which we share through our baptism.

Meeting the good news of what Jesus Christ has done for us is a turning point in our lives. We yield to the power of Jesus' love for us, and his story becomes our story. We mark the steps of the journey by gathering every week to be reminded of His love for us, and our love for each other.
