"Riding through the Three-Day Tunnel"

"Four year-old Sally will tell you, every time she sees a cross: 'Look, God died.' When she visits museums and churches where she knows there are crucifixes, she will say, 'I want to go see. I want to see how God died.' It is startling and a little alarming for the adults around her to hear. Very young kids, though, think and talk about death even if they haven't seen or experienced it. Their understanding of what death is, their emotional affect when they talk about it, and the way they cope when it happens in their family, is different for them than it is for adults."

Sally has heard the good news that Jesus rose from the dead. It's hard to say if that truth is as concrete to her as the image of Christ on the cross. Sally is just thinking about the fact that God died. God is with us, Immanuel, in life and in death.

God is always with us. God is pretty much the best train-riding companion ever as we, along with Sally, make our way through that tunnel from death to new life, darkness to light. Soon (April 18-21), we will ride that tunnel along with Jesus. It is a shared experience of Jesus' final acts, his death, and his resurrection.

Holy and innocent, Jesus is executed on the cross by religious and Roman powers. On that cross with him were human sin, disease, disablement, depression, despair, cruelty, intolerance, division, and so much more. All those hung in darkness for about three hours until he died. ... But wait! There was more. Light breaks out on Sunday - new life, joy and hope. Let us all gather together for this year's tunnel ride.



We were blessed to have so much help when many of our usual volunteers were unavailable.


