An important addition is a monthly "Outreach" envelope. Each month we will announce what the Outreach offering for that month has been designated for. The Outreach offering would go toward things like Food Pantries, ELCA World Hunger, Care-A-Lot Preschool, Church world Service Blankets or Tools, and more.

For January 2020, your Outreach envelope will be used for AHUB - Advocates for the Homeless of Upper Bucks. AHUB operates a Code Blue Shelter at the former Masonic Lodge in Quakertown, which is open on nights in November through March when the temperature drops below 26°. Your gift supports a part-time coordinator, supplies for the homeless and the volunteer staff, and more.
