"We Pray for the Spiritual Gift of PATIENCE"

"How long, O Lord? Will you forget me forever? How long will you hide your face from me? Hoe long must I bear pain in my soul, and have sorrow in my heart

> All day long? How long shall my enemy be exalted over me?" *Psalm 13:1-2*

" ... the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, **PATIENCE**, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control." *Galatians 5:22-23*

It's been six weeks now, since we've been told to stay-at-home, avoid all but essential trips, wash hands over and over again, practice physical distancing with at least 6 feet between us, wear masks, etc. etc. etc. And its getting harder and harder to live with this pandemic. Frustration, boredom, anger, and *impatience* may be building in many of us. I miss being with all of you at least once a week. We miss being with each other -- family members, neighbors, co-workers, schoolmates, close friends.

It's been six weeks or more ... But it's also been just two weeks since Easter began. Some of you may have heard my recent message on April 19, when I repeated over and over again -- "It's still Easter." Christ is risen! And with his resurrection, Jesus has given the world hope for all circumstances, even this once-in-a-lifetime pandemic.

In fact, St. Paul, writing to the Galatian Christians in the first century, reminded them that the Spirit of the risen Christ, the Holy Spirit, had freely granted them many spiritual gifts, including the gift of *patience*. Those early Christians may not have been facing a pandemic. But they were trying to faithfully follow Jesus in the face of poverty, rejection, persecution, even martyrdom. Paul himself was facing all those things, yet he would not stop his prayer and his proclamation of the Good News for the world. It is easy to be patient when everything is normal, or seems to be going our way. It's much more difficult when we feel challenged or trapped, or when we're afraid.

That is what we are being called to draw upon now - the gift of *patience*. And we are not asked to be patient in a vacuum. We can be patient

Because of God's patience with humanity from the beginning. God is patient, granting us forgiveness for our sin. God is patient in trying to save us. God sends Jesus to die for us and rise for us. Even stuck in our houses, the risen Christ is with us with promises of forgiveness, new life, and yes -- a future. It is a future of life, not death.

It's been six weeks now, and I do not know how much longer we'll be asked to live like this. But in faith, I want to believe that the Spirit has given me and you the fit of **patience**. Let us patiently continue to observe the health rules imposed for our safety. Let us patiently love our children, parents, and leaders.

By the way, just because we are so restricted, it does not mean that we cannot continue to reach out to one another -- in prayer, on Facebook, with texts, e-mails, and by helping to supply our most vulnerable neighbors with the essential supplies they need.

Today I cannot tell you when we will be able to be together physically as we were until March 17. But I can assure you with the Psalmist and with the Apostle Paul and with the whole Church, that it is still Easter. Christ is risen! He is with all of us. We can draw o his loving presence and spirit of *patience*, living our lives in new ways ... for a time.

If you do watch live, please feel free to interact with each other in the comments. The children's coloring page and Children's Worship Bulletin are posted on our website (www.durhamlutheran.org) for kids who want to worship, too.
- <u>Devotions with Dave on Facebook Live, Tuesday mornings at 10 AM</u>. We use our Whirl Sunday School curriculum to sing songs, tell stories, and say prayers. A Family Activity Sheet that goes along with the weekly lesson is posted on Facebook and on our website.
- <u>Power Hour of Prayer, every evening between 7 and 8:00 PM</u> Participate in your own way in your own home, but we are all praying together. (Not on Facebook)
- <u>Keep in touch with each other</u> by phone, texts, email, etc. Check on the most vulnerable among us.
- <u>Use your Outreach offering envelopes</u> to support important mission issues. The April envelope was in support of the Kathy Hlavaty Scholarship Fund for Care-A-Lot Preschool. **The May Outreach envelope will support our local food pantries - The Lord's Pantry in Ottsville (connected to Philabundance) and Project of Easton (connected to Feed America).**

As we will probably not be gathering in church during May, we will not be physically collecting items for the food banks.

The designated **Outreach envelope will be designated for ProJeCt Easton** and The Lord's Pantry.

We will not hold Blanket Sunday in May. Hopefully we will be able to do this later in the year.

WELCA will not meet in May. Because we do not feel we should hold the proceeds from our Soup Suppers until we can meet physically, we are going to do a mail vote.


