SE Pennsylvania Synod: "Outreach Offering" (special envelope) for October will be designated to our SE Pennsylvania Synod. The Synod includes 143 congregations and some congregations are struggling to function, especially financially. Our Synod is trying to respond and help in whatever ways it can. But our Bishop Patricia Davenport reported to us recently that the Synod is more than \$100,000 behind what is expected to receive by the end of the summer. This means the Synod is restricted in assisting congregations and ministries that need help.
