### "Thanksgiving, Faith, and Hope"

(Some words from St. Paul to the Philippian Church)

"I thank my God every time I remember you, constantly praying with joy in every one of my prayers for all of you, because of your sharing in the gospel from the first day until now... for all of you share in God's grace with me... And this is my prayer, that your love may overflow more and more with knowledge and full insight... having produced the harvest of righteousness that comes through Jesus Christ for the glory and praise of God." Yes, Donna and I will now be retired pastors. But we will still be guided by Thanksgiving, Faith and Hope. We will trust that a loving God will sustain us. God will continue to accomplish yet un-imagined things through your continued ministry. I love all of you and am so grateful for the time I was able to share with you.

#### A Few things we know right now:

Pastor Dave will preach his last sermon on September 26. After that day he will be required to sever all pastoral connections to the congregation. We ask that you watch your email for information (For those without email, we will continue to snail mail you) and announcements will be made at church services as well. We all know that there is no replacing Pastor Dave, but with everyone working together and with God's help we will get through this change.
