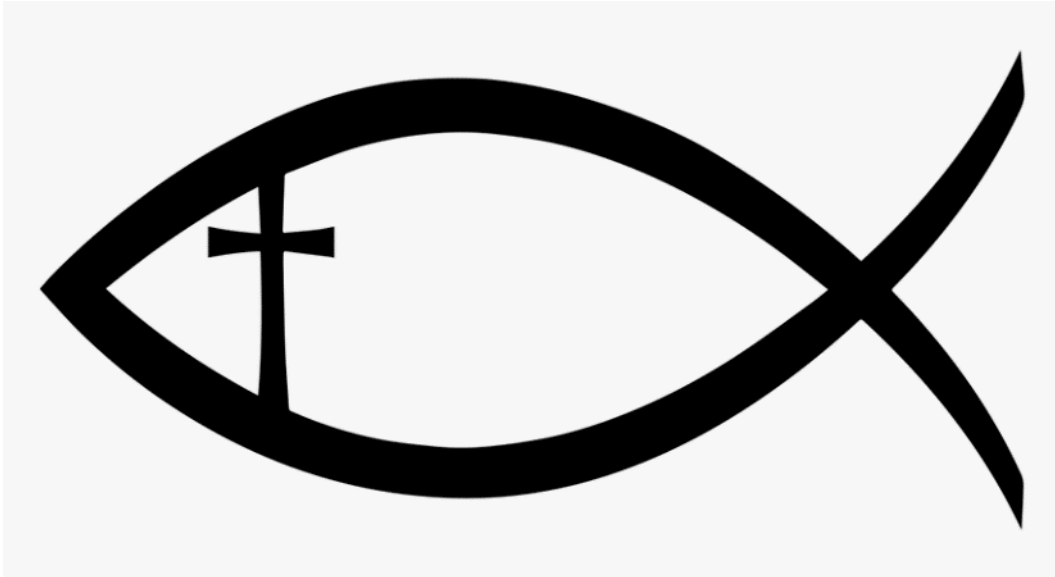

First Reading- Daniel 7: 9-10, 13-14

As I watched, thrones were set in place, and an Ancient One took his throne; his clothing was white as snow, and the hair of his head like pure wool; his throne was fiery flames, and its wheels were burning fire. A stream of fire issued and flowed out from his presence.

(At this time, remove the seal above the small chalice. Hold the chalice in your hand.)

P: This is the blood of Christ, shed for you. Take and drink.

(Drink the wine or grape juice. Set down the small chalice for prayer.)

P: (Communion Blessing) The Body and Blood of our Lord Jesus Christ strengthen you and keep you in his grace. AMEN.

Prayer after Communion (said by Pastor)

Blessing (Pastor) : God, the beginning and the end, who has written your name in the book of life, + bless and keep you in grace and peace from this time forth and forevermore. AMEN.
