Transition Team Meeting

The Transition Team had its first meeting with our consultant, Reverend Shirley Guider, on Tuesday, February 8. Reverend Guider gave the team a basic outline of what needs to be done to produce the Ministry Site Profile (MSP) which is used by the synod to pick pastors that would be best suited to the needs of our church.

The team has scheduled three meeting that will involve the congregation. The three meetings will cover the following topics:

Remembering the Past (a history of Evangelical Lutheran Durham) March 20
What We Do (ministries of the congregation and resources that support these activities)
April 24

Focus on the Future (what Evangelical Durham is looking for in a pastor) May 22

All of these sessions will be held immediately after Sunday service. The meetings will be streamed online and people watching on the internet will be able to submit written comments after the meeting. It is important that the congregation supply input during these meeting as this information will be used by the Transition Team when filling out the MSP.

- What are things you still laugh about?

During the tenure of the pastors you've had, what events were happening in the world that had an affect on the church?
