Dear sisters and brothers in Christ,

It is with great joy and honor that I introduce myself as your new Bridge Pastor. While I have always enjoyed supply preaching here at Durham, to have the opportunity to serve with you in ministry during your vacancy was an unexpected gift. Let me begin by telling you a little bit about myself. I was born November 4, 1952, the second of three children to Eleanor and James Heckman of Willow Grove, PA. After graduating from Upper Dublin High School, I received an Associate Degree in Electrical Engineering Technology from Penn State University. It was during that time that I felt the call to the ministry of Word and Sacrament. That mandated I return to college to receive a BS in Sociology with a minor in psychology. From college I entered The Lutheran Theological Seminary at Philadelphia (now United Lutheran) and as ordained on June 8, 1980. It was during my driving years that the Synod reached out to ask if I would be interested in Bridge work. I agreed and I have served at St. Paul's on Red Hill, Peace Lutheran in Tohickon, Holy Trinity in Quakertown (as designated supply), and St. John's, Ridge Valley. Evangelical Durham will be my last Bridge as my wife (a physician assistant) is retiring in December and we intend to enjoy the new freedoms which retirement allows to visit our family and travel.

Speaking of family, Linda and I live in Hilltown Township (Hatfield mailing address) and have been blessed with two sons. Eric, who is a physician, is married to Stephanie. They live in Somerville, MA (near Boston) with their two children – James who will be 8 in April and Julie who will be three this November. Our second son is Justin. He is a director of purchasing for prescription drugs for all the pharmacies in supermarkets owned by the Ahold Delhaize Company (the store chain you may recognize from around here is Giant). He and his fiancé Cassie, live in Portland, Maine and will be married June 25 of this year. Since both our children and grandchildren live in New England, we are looking forward to spending much more time with them in the years to come.

Now let me say a few words about my work here at Durham. As a Bridge Pastor, I have found it helpful to look at the image of a bridge to give me guidance. As a congregation, you were on a stable "land" for the last 26 years and things were good and safe. Now the earth been shaken, and you can no longer stay on that land. Your only choice is to seek out a new "land" in which to live. Unfortunately, the only way to get from one land to another is over the large "vacancy" chasm which separates the two. You need to have a bridge to help you traverse that chasm and you need someone to help build and guide you over that bridge. That's my job. A couple things you should know about this bridge. First, it is a one-way bridge. My task is to keep you moving forward and not turn around and try and go back. Second, like Moses who lead the people through the wilderness to the promised land, I will lead you through the wilderness, but I will not be going with you to the other side. That will be your newly called pastor's job. The one thing that is consistent with all of this is God's Spirit guiding us. Just as God blessed you over the last 26 years, that same Spirit of blessing goes with us across the bridge and into the "promised land" to come.

Finally, because of my bus driving schedule, my time at Durham is limited until the end of June. Beginning in April, I will be in the office on Wednesdays from 10:30 to 12:15. Please stop by if you wish. In July, I will probably be in the office at least 2 days a week for longer periods and I will also be doing more visitations of shut-ins. Watch for more details in the months ahead. In the meantime, if you need pastoral care feel free to call/text me at 267-664-3160 or email me at BridgePastor.ELD@gmail.com. I will also be arriving at church on Sunday mornings by 10:00 and I will be available after worship on those Sundays that I am preaching. (Note: As it stands now, Pastor Guider will be preaching one Sunday a month as a part of the transition process.) I look forward to being with you especially as we quickly are arriving at the sacred time of Holy Week and Easter. It will be especially sweet this year to once again be in the church unmasked (if desired). I pray God's power and peace be with us on trip across the bridge.
