



Second, the education program here at Durham is clearly important. I just attended my first Care-a-lot board meeting, and I was very impressed with the program I see them developing. But it also reminded me that there has been a desire to get the Sunday education program up and running again, but right now it is in desperate need of leadership. I hope some who might have helped lead it in the past might step up to help us get it started again. If you would like to help, please send me an email letting me know your interest. I would hope to have an initial planning meeting sometime in May. Watch the bulletin for a date.

While technically it is a part of the education program, the third item I want to mention is the Confirmation Program. Over the past number of years, Durham has been working with St. Peters and Trinity on preparing youth for Confirmation. Upon my arrival, I have found that three of the four young people from Durham who have been participating in the classes are ready to be confirmed and that will happen here at Durham on Sunday, June 12th. I hope we can have a packed house to celebrate with Addy Manmana, Clayton Helfrich and Ben Naska when then affirm their Baptismal Covenant with God.

My fourth and final item also involves the education program. It has come to my attention that there are a number of young people who would be able to receive their first holy communion, but they need to have a preparation class. In order to solve this problem, I will be holding a First Communion Class for anyone in 1st grade and up who has not yet received their First Communion instruction on Saturday, May 21st from 9 to noon. This will allow the participants of the class to receive their first Communion on Sunday, June 5th (Pentecost Sunday). If you know of someone who needs this class, please email me that name. I need to know how many participants I will have so that I can get the materials ordered in time.

As always, if you have any questions, concerns or comments, don't be afraid to email me or stop into the Church office on Wednesdays from 10:30 to 12:15 when I am there, or you can plan to see me before worship (I am there be 10) or after. I look forward to moving forward with you as we continue our journey across the bridge to your new ministry home.

Outreach

Food banks: Thanks to all who contributed to our collection for our foodbanks this month, and to Barb and Ben Naska who donated a food basket filled with coffee and jelly. Both food banks were really appreciative for what they received. ProJeCt always has need for jelly; they also always have a need for pasta. The Lord's Pantry always can use soup; so, we are collected soup and crackers for them. We will continue to collect canned meats. Besides canned chicken and fish, other canned meals, like chili or stew would also be a good donation. They are also low on snack foods, chips, pretzels etc.
