Greetings sisters and brothers in Christ,

As I write this letter it is the first day of fall and only three months until Christmas. Time flies when your having fun. And boy did we have fun last Sunday (September 18th) with the dedication of the new playground equipment, the church picnic, and welcoming a number of the families from the newly reopened Care-a-lot Program. We were truly blessed with a perfect day, the energy of the children was invigorating, and the food was abundant and delicious. I want to thank those who help put this wonderful day together, shared the food and of course, I want to thank God for all the blessings.

I also want to thank the congregation for your amazing response to the "God's Work, Our Hands" project on September 11th, when we joined with Trinity, Pleasant Valley, St. Peter's, Riegelsville, and St. Luke's, Ferndale as we gathered the clean-up materials to fill 16 buckets which were delivered and may already be in use. With relatively short notice, you came through. If you are still interested in supporting clean-up, Lutheran Disaster Fund (Lutheran World Relief) does welcome financial support. But now it is time to turn our attention to what lies ahead.

The long Season of Pentecost is drawing to a close and with it comes three Sunday's of note.

First is Sunday, October 2nd, which is celebrated as World Communion Sunday. This is the Sunday when all Christian denominations celebrate the Lord's Supper in recognition that all our sisters and brothers in Christ are all sharing this meal around the world. I love the image of one long communion meal going on across the globe for the entire day. Hope you will be a part of it.

Second, is the last Sunday in October, the 30th. The last Sunday of October is celebrated as Reformation Sunday – the day we remember and celebrate the leadership and courage of Martin Luther who's desire to have open discussions about some issues going on in the church at that time, caused a ripple effect which lead to the founding of the Lutheran Church. In honor of this tradition, not only will we be celebrating Holy Communion, but after worship, I will be hosting a special Forum entitled: "How do we as Lutherans express our faith in the politics of our world today?" This is obviously a timely topic as election day will only be a little over a week away, and it is obviously a "HOT" topic. THIS WILL NOT BE A FORUM TO CONVINCE YOU WHO TO VOTE FOR! Rather, it will be a time to address the question of how do we live out the Lutheran Doctrine of "In but not Of the world". The forum will be held following the worship. All are invited to attend. All I ask is that you bring an open mind and a willingness to listen to each other. If you have any questions, please contact me.

The Third Sunday doesn't actually fall in October, but the first Sunday in November. That is All Saints' Sunday which falls on the first Sunday of November each year, this year's date being November 6th. I mention it this month because I will need your help to be ready for it. We will be doing things a little different. In years past, a memorial list of those who died since last All Saints' Day were read and candles lit. We are doing that again this year, but we are also adding something which is a tradition that I have celebrated in my previous congregations. That is, we not only recognize those who have died in the last year (I call them the Omega Saints), but we also celebrate those who began their saintly journey since last year by being Baptized. These I call the Alpha Saints. This is where I need your help. While anyone who was baptized or died here at Evangelical Durham automatically go on the list, we also want to invite you to add to the list with the name of people you know who were Baptized or entered into life eternal since November 1st, 2021.
