Greetings sisters and brothers in Christ,

HAPPY NEW YEAR! No, I am not confused. I know this is my December newsletter article and not January, and I stand by my greeting, Happy New Year! As Christians we actually observe two new year's celebrations. Along with the rest of the world we celebrate the beginning of a new calendar year each January 1<sup>st</sup>. But as Christians, we celebrate another new year – a liturgical new year. It isn't always the same date, but it is always around the same time, four weeks before Christmas. Obviously, I am referring to the celebration of Advent which commences the four Sundays before Christmas Day. This year our liturgical new year begins on Sunday, November 27<sup>th</sup>. Like the astronomical new year, our liturgical new year brings with it the grace and hope of anew beginning as well as an opportunity to let go of the pain and sinfulness of the past year.

Here at Durham, the newness of this year is in a returning to a sense of normalcy. Like all other churches, the last two years have had to be adjusted to deal with Covid. In addition, you have had the adjustment of saying goodbye to a beloved pastor of 20 plus years. Much of the last year which I have spent with you as your Bridge Pastor, has been focused on stabilizing things and looking toward the future, and I think we have done that. (continued on Page 2)

Your Transition Team and Council worked very hard to put together your mission profile and make it available to future candidates. Now is the time of faithful waiting — putting our trust in the Holy Spirit and the guidance of the Call Committee. In the meantime, there has been a lot of effort put into "getting things going again" and your efforts are bearing fruit. Our in-person worship has continued to increase and our commitment to continuing our on –line presence, will allow us to have our worship continue as the center of strength and growth over the next year.

However, worship is not the only place of renewed energy and life. Over the last year, our participation in the Palisades Area Lutheran Ministry (PALM) has increased. We joyfully share with St. Peter's, Trinity, and St. Luke's in a confirmation program and are considering additional activities which we might undertake for our older youth. We also worked with those churches for Vacation Bible School and are looking forward to our joint leadership of a "Live Nativity" hosted here at Durham on December 17 (more details later in the newsletter). Also we are participating in a "friendly competition" with the other churches in a social ministry collection of food for the hungry with the "Reverse Advent Calendar Challenge". In the newsletter you will see the list of items to be collected. The idea is that instead of taking one item out each day of advent as a part of our Advent devotion, we are reversing the process and putting one item in the box or bag which, when filled on December 25, will be brought to church and then donated to each church's' supported food banks. The "competition" comes in seeing which church can fill the most boxes. We are asking that your completed boxes or bags be brought to the church by January 8<sup>th</sup>. The winning church will be the guest at a PALM (palisades Lutheran Ministry) Dinner.

As you can see, things are happening here at Church, and I want you all to be a part of it. I encourage you to worship regularly. We are trying to keep everyone up to date with an expanded announcement section in the weekly bulletin. However, if you ever have any questions, please don't hesitate to contact me or a member of the Church Council.

While I am very excited about what this new year holds. I also recognize that this will also be the year that we will part ways as you will be (by God's grace) welcoming your new full-time pastor. As I said before, the excitement of this year is the opportunity to build to the anticipated new birth with the new pastor. In the meantime, let's have fun growing together in Christ.


