Pastor's Message:

Greetings sisters and brothers in Christ,

Dear sisters and brothers in Christ,

I have to begin this letter by apologizing to you for the newsletter being a little later than we would normally like. IT IS MY FAULT NOT KEN'S. I have been so wrapped up with the added activities getting ready for Lent, that I forgot about my letter until this morning when Ken asked me if I had emailed it yet? I had to confess to him that I had completely forgotten about it. Consequently, I am making Ken's life more challenging. Sorry Ken.

What I can tell you is that I am very excited about this year's Lenten Journey with you here at Durham. While Lent carries a tone of solemnity, devotion and reflection, we here at Durham fully embraced the pre-Lenten practice of celebration prior to the journey. On Shrove Tuesday (Donut Day or Fastnacht) February 21st, over 30 revelers gathered for a delicious potluck supper and I did a demonstration of making the ashes from last year's palms. These ashes are what worshippers will(did) receive at the Ash Wednesday Services. I also had the opportunity to share them with our Care-a-lot children. We learned about palm trees and some of the fruits they bear (including a sampling of Fig Newtons), I shared with them the symbolism of the ashen cross by placing it on their hands. I also reminded them that just as the image of death represented by the ash cross could be washed away with soap and water, that our death is washed away in the water of Baptism. Finally, we talked about the children's game "Ring Around the Rosie". We sang it several times and each time popped up with great joy and laughter showing death that it could not keep us down.

There was something wonderful about my seeing this Ash Wednesday through the eyes of the children for the first time. It was a reminder that each of us needs to come to our Lenten journey with the same child-like eyes of wonder and openness. Yes, its true that Lent probably isn't anyone's favorite Christian season, yet it is the heart of what makes Easter so beloved.

This year our journey we are not walking alone. We are walking side by side with our sisters and brothers from PALM (Palisades Area Lutheran Ministries). Before you know it, March will have come and gone, and we will be standing at the beginning of Holy Week with Palm/Passion Sunday, Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, and concluding with Easter Sunday. Please keep watch for specific times for these activities.

While all this is going on, don't forget to keep your Call Committee and New Council in your prayers. Both these groups are filled with devoted children of God who are giving of their time and talents, and guided by the Holy Spirit, are endeavoring to guide Durham's ministry into the future.

Exciting things are happening here at Durham and I look forward to sharing these times with you. See you in Church.




