Pastor's Message:

Dear sisters and brothers in Christ,

As I type this letter, Linda and I are in the final stages of planning a very exciting trip to Alaska. This is actually a trip that I have dreamed of since I was a boy and decided that I wanted to visit every state in the union. It became a reality a couple of years ago, when my wife and I made some final decisions regarding our retirements. Summer of 2023 was the time and the actually planning began. Then in March of 2022, I accepted your invitation to be your Bridge Pastor, fully hoping that by June of 2023, you would have another pastor and we could leave for Alaska with no obligations. However, that's not how things have worked out.

Several months ago, when it looked like you would still need my services through the summer, I spoke to the Council regarding our trip. They were 100% in support of our going and assured me that they could handle things in my absence. With their support, our planning continued and has intensified.

That planning now included making sure that Durham had the emergency pastoral care coverage that might be needed. I spoke with my fellow clergy of PALM, and they have graciously agreed to cover Durham during my absence. I am eternally grateful for their help and support. In the event that emergency pastoral care is needed, please contact the Office (Ken Anderson) and he will make the appropriate pastoral contact.

The other coverage I needed to secure was Sunday morning worship. This proved to be a much more difficult task. Finding clergy supply is always challenging, but to find them in the summer is almost impossible. After making a dozen calls, I was only able to secure two clergy to help cover a couple of the weeks. This left me with a dilemma. I took my problem to the Worship & Music committee, and they suggested that I use some lay preachers; in fact, you have done so before and they saw no problem doing so again. So that is what I have done. With their support, I finally have put together a coverage calendar. Following is that schedule (Note the adjusted schedule for communion).


