

### **Congregational Meeting**

December 10, 2023

There will be a congregational meeting immediately after the worship service on December 10 followed by a covered dish dinner. This meeting will be for the following proposed agenda items:

- 1. Convert Pastor Heckman from part time bridge pastor to 3/4 time pastor for a 3 year contract.
- 2. Approve the 2024 Budget (see page 6-7).
- 3. Replace the chair lift and carpet on the stairs to the Fellowship hall.

Please be sure to attend this important meeting, as **your** participation is vital! 

#### Pastor's Message:

Dear Evangel Family,

For the last two years, I have been blessed to be the Bridge Pastor at Durham. First starting in October 2021 as a supply preacher, preaching here at least twice a month. Then in March of 2022, I officially became your Bridge Pastor and together we began our journey of eager anticipation, awaiting the Spirit's action to send you a new permanent pastor. And wait we did. What quickly became clear was that Durham's vacancy would not be filled. While this was disappointing to some, it was a blessing for me because I got to continue working with you. I came to appreciate your openness, welcoming nature, and generosity. I discovered a congregation that was not willing to just sit around and wait - you wanted to be about growing your ministry, and I was excited to help you along the way, within the limits of being the Bridge Pastor. By this past summer, when word came that there was a possible candidate, I found myself with mixed emotions: while I certainly wanted what was best for Durham, I was also saddened to think that I might be ending my relationship with you. Alas, that person was not the right one and so we again went into waiting mode.

While waiting, the other consistent element was the repeated expressed wishes that I might become your permanent pastor. While I was always flattered, I also know that full time for me was neither possible nor desirable. Yet I found myself saying to my wife, "if there was a way for me to serve part-time, I would consider it." The reality was that I am not the answer for Durham as long-term, full-time pastor, so I found myself being content enjoying our time together, secretly hoping that it would go on for a while.

#### Pastor's Message (Continued from page 2):

Then something happened. At the end of the Council Meeting in October, one of the members asked, "Pastor, what is the difference between a Bridge Pastor and a part-time pastor?" I answered the question reminding all that a Bridge Pastor was only there to keep you together, kind of a marking time, until the new pastor arrives. By definition, a Bridge Pastor is to be short-term, and it is not the Bridge's job to institute new programs which a new pastor might not appreciate. Also, a Bridge does not devote a lot of time getting to know the specifics of the congregation. I am here for Council guidance, leading worship, and pastoral care. While a part-time pastor is a pastor in full, only being limited to the number of hours negotiated with the church. This means that a clear list of pastoral duties needs to be established and prioritized.

As I drove home that night, I kept thinking about that question and wondering what would be the best for Durham? As I reflected on the situation here, I recognized that several circumstances had changed since my arrival. Most notably our relationship with PALM and the new initiative within PALM about doing joint ministry in the future which may indeed involve shared pastoral services. It seemed to me to be even more challenging to get a new pastor right now not knowing if, in a couple of years, the pastoral profile in PALM may be cause for change. I know as a pastor, that is probably not a circumstance I would want to enter. Then it struck me! What if I regularized my relationship with the Durham congregation, I could help provide a stable period of time for the church to work with PALM through the questions of shared ministry/pastoral support and also provide a ministry platform allowing Durham to move forward with issues like building and mission development. It would also allow time for you to determine if you really need a full-time pastor and can you really afford one.

There were some obvious questions about such a change since it is normally a no-no for a Bridge to regularize a call at the same congregation. Also, I had to inquire as to what impact this kind of change would have on my standing as a retired pastor and possible taxes or other financial penalties I might face. It also clearly had to get the OK from the Bishop's office. So, after hours of conversation with my wife and many more hours in prayer, I still felt encouraged and called by the Spirit to pursue the process.

To try and make this long story shorter, I found there were no issues with my retirement status nor any significant tax or other financial issues. My wife was and is very supportive of the idea, and the Bishop approved the plan with enthusiasm. The only directive from the Bishop was, due to the logistical challenge for me to change my status from retired to regular call status, the Bishop's recommended that we make it a contracted relationship rather than a regularized call. So, on October 29<sup>th</sup>, there was a special council meeting called with the Dean, Rev. Erika Wesch overseeing the discussion. What was proposed was: beginning January 1, 2024 I would become your pastor, serving part-time (3/4 time = approximately 30 hours a week) for a term of 3 years.

After a number of meetings and financial considerations, this plan was approved to go forward. Now there is just one last step to take, and that will be Sunday, December 10<sup>th</sup> when you, the people of Evangelical Durham, will have to vote to approve the contract as well as approve the 2024 budget which reflects the funding for said contract. At that meeting there will be a lot more information shared about the specifics of the changes to my duties, the financial implications, and explanations regarding the impact to the future calling of a pastor. Assuming it is approved, your mission profile will be pulled down and you will no longer be considered as being vacant.

I was tempted to begin my letter with: "I have some good news and some bad news." Then to share that I would no longer be your Bridge Pastor effective December 31, 2023. And that beginning January 1, 2024, I would be your new pastor. I will have to leave it up to you as to which statement is good news and which is bad news.

Almost every Sunday since I have been here, I have tried to include in the Prayer of the Church a petition that God's Spirit shines upon Durham and sends the right pastor for the next period of your ministry life. While I initially thought that was someone else, I believe that the Spirit was always working, and it took this long for me to listen to what God had in mind for the needed pastoral guidance here at Durham for the next several years. I truly believe this is what is best for Evangelical Durham and a blessing for me.

I'm sure that there are many questions, concerns and issues which will need to be addressed and I look forward to doing that with you. One thing that will not change is your accessibility to you. The increase in my hours will mostly take place on Tuesdays, still leaving my Mondays and Fridays off. My phone will not change, and although my email will change, its connection to me will not. I will continue to eat lunch at church on most Wednesdays and Thursdays and always welcome lunch companions.

While I look forward to being your pastor, I also know that the three years will fly by and the work we will need to do together to enable you to be ready to move on will be significant. We will have a lot of work to do, but I also know that we will have a lot of love, joy and fun doing it together.


