Pastor's Message:

Dear Evangel Family,

As I prepared to write this letter, I took time to look back at my letter for January 2023. I talked about getting ready for the changes that a new year would bring, including the welcoming of your new pastor. Little did I realize that new pastor would be me and you did indeed welcome me warmly.

The other thing I did was to encourage you to adopt three resolutions for the new year. The first was to continue to be warm and welcoming. You have kept that resolution 100%. I look forward to it continuing into 2024.

The second was to increase your stewardship. Not just financially (which you have started to do), but also your time and talents for the ministry programs both here at Durham and with PALM. As with the first resolution, you have done this. We just celebrated our second year hosting the Live Nativity as well as the continued Confirmation Class with the PALM churches. I am looking forward to increased activities with PALM including a revitalized Vacation Church School and joint services in Lent. I also anticipate a deeper level of conversation about joint ministry in the future. I fully expect that there will be a joint council retreat in the spring to pursue this topic.

The third resolution was to take a look at the physical plant of Durham. We have also made progress with this resolution. We voted in December to replace the stair glide and we anticipate this being accomplished early in 2024. We have also established a Building Committee which is looking at what are the needs and how to deal with them. I anticipate definitive action from this committee will also be forth coming in early 2024.

As a whole, I could not be any happier about where the ministry of Evangelical Durham went in 2023 and I am extremely excited about what 2024 holds for us. In that light I would recommend the following resolutions for this year.

First, tackle the issue of children's ministry. While our Care-a-lot program is a great success (we will be celebrating the 40^{th} Anniversary of the school on June 30^{th}), the Christian Education element is still having trouble recovering from Covid. One of the great joys has been seeing more families at Durham with Children. As we get more and more children the challenge becomes, how do we share our Christian faith with them? While I do not believe that the traditional Sunday School program from the 1960's still works, that does not mean there are not other ways to get the word out.

Second, I want to challenge us to grow our worship attendance. Of course, that can happen in two ways: it can be accomplished by your being there more often yourself, or by inviting others to come with you.

Third, to find a new opportunity to serve in the church. By far the greatest challenge to doing ministry is to get the volunteers needed to carry out the programs we undertake. Christian Education is a fitting example - unless we have adults willing to help, no plan will work. Whether it is something like serving on council or another committee to volunteering to help lead a Lemonade on the Lawn your help is needed. Remember attending worship is not just a matter of being there, but you are also encouraged to help lead worship as greeter, lector, usher, altar guild, choir member, or acolyte.

Finally, a personal goal for myself is to get an up-to-date church directory and then for me to visit all our families. This will not only help me to get to know you better, it will also allow me to pick your brain about the role that Evangelical Durham plays in your life, as well as any thoughts and suggestions you might have regarding the church's future. You can help me reach this goal by signing up or my visitation chart in the narthex of the church.

As I look ahead to the new year, I am filled with great joy and expectation. I believe things will be even more exciting in 2024. I am glad to be making the journey together.

It's assumed that Mary rode on a donkey, but the Bible doesn't say she did.

It's assumed there was an innkeeper, but it doesn't mention one anywhere.

It's assumed there were three Magi, but it doesn't give a number of those who showed up.

It's assumed there was a star overhead when Jesus was born, but it doesn't say that either.

It's assumed that Jesus was born in a stable, but all it says is that He was laid in a manger - and that could've been any number of places.

Christmas comes with many assumptions—some helpful, some not so much. Spirituality also comes with many assumptions, and the ones that fail us are the ones we make about what it's supposed to look like, who is worthy for it to happen to, and what kind of outcome it's supposed to have for us. Assumptions like . . .

You should be more than you are now to be pleasing to God.

Your weaknesses are in the way of God's plan for your life.

Your lack of religious excitement disqualifies you from divine participation.

You're probably not doing it right.

Other spiritual people have something you don't have.

Our assumptions hinder our spiritual journey in all kinds of ways, and the antidote to assumption is surprise. The surprise of Christ's incarnation is that it happened in Mary's day as it is happening every day in your lack of resources, your overcrowded lodging, your unlit night sky, your humble surroundings.

It's a surprise that life can come through barren places.

It's a surprise that meek nobodies partake in divine plans.

It's a surprise that messengers are sent all along the hidden journey of life to let you know you are not alone.

It's a surprise that you will be given everything you need to accomplish what you've been asked to do.

It's a surprise that nothing can separate you from the love of God.

Nothing can separate you from love. Your assumptions believe there must be something that can . . . But surprise! Nothing can.

May you thank God with joyful surprise at how much you have assumed incorrectly.


