# SEPTEMBER 2024

## Pastor's Message:

Dear fellow children of God,

It feels like it was only yesterday that I was sitting and writing my August Newsletter, and here it is halfway through August and time to start writing for September, and there is a lot to cover.

Let me begin by saying what a joy it was to preach from your suggestions during July and August. While it took some extra work, the discussions were very rewarding. I think something similar might be considered in the future. That being said, I am always open to hearing from you regarding questions or issues which might need to be addressed to the whole congregation.

As we look ahead to September, here is a listing of upcoming activities and events of which you need to be aware.

On Tuesday, September 3, the pastors and councils from the six PALM Churches will be meeting with Rev. William Colman, the pastor of St. Paul's Lutheran Church in Telford. Pastor Colman was a pastor serving in the Erie, PA area which successfully went through the process very similar to what we are attempting in PALM. We are hopeful that his insight will help us discern our next steps.

Thursday. September  $5^{th}$  our Adult Bible Study Group will begin meeting again. We will be studying the Gospel of Luke (which is the Gospel we will be using beginning in Advent). We will be meeting at the Church.

On Saturday, September 14 at 2:00 PM, we will be installing Southeastern Synod's new Bishop, The Rev. Bryan Penman at the Philadelphia Episcopal Cathedral. I will be attending and participating in the procession of Pastors. If anyone is interested in attending, it is open to the public. Maybe a carpool can be arranged. At the very least, keep the new Bishop and our Synod in your prayers.

Tuesday, September 10th, our Care-a-lot program begins it's  $41^{st}$  year. We will be welcoming them back at our worship on Sunday, September 15. I hope to have a full house to make them feel at home.

After a very successful Wednesday Sundae program over the summer, our Christian Education activities continue in the fall. I strongly encourage you to read Kat Wagner's article for all the details. What is especially exciting is the beginning of a new worship opportunity for the whole family. It is called "Messy Church". This program is based upon the fact that for many folks, life is messy so we should make some room for a little messiness our worship opportunities. TH Messy Church Worship will begin in September, on the third Saturday of each month (September 21, October 19, November 16, December 21 and January 18) anyone who is interested is welcome to come and join for an intergeneration fellowship, educational, worship and meal.

This will usually take place in the basement of the church (although September and October may be outside weather permitting). Keep your eyes and ears open for more information.

As you may or may not be aware, a Building Committee was set up and has been working on the issue of still needing a restroom on the first floor. We also recognize that there is inadequate space for the Pastor and the administrative assistant for each to have appropriate office space. After considerable conversation and investigation, we have arrived at the point of contracting with a local architect to come up with a drawing for an annex building that would be built between the current church and the cemetery. It would be connected to the church building by a hallway which would enter the church through the window area in the Narthex where the current mailboxes are located. They hope that the drawings and floorplan will be ready to present to the congregation early in 2025. The wonderful news is that there is currently just under \$800,000 in our endowment funds specifically restricted for just such a project. While this will be a change for Durham, it is one which will help prepare the church for future ministry.

September 22 is the first class for our Confirmation Classes 2024-25 season. This year our PALM Confirmation Program will have 13 or so youth, with 6 of them being from Durham. I am very excited with the upcoming class and the addition of a confirmation retreat the first weekend in January.

Sunday, September 22 will also be Harvest Sunday.

Monday, September 23 will mark the beginning of a four-week vacation for Linda and me while we will be making our way across the country to Albuquerque New Mexico where we will witness the world's largest hot air balloon festival. We are planning on being home sometime around October  $17^{th}$ . While I am away, there will be a couple of Supply pastors filling in. September 29 will be Pastor Shirly Guider, and on October 6 and 20 it will be Pastor David Lutcher. The October  $13^{th}$  service will be covered by the Stewardship Committee. Although we will be back in town before the  $20^{th}$ , Linda and I have been invited back to Temple Lutheran Church where I was the Pastor for  $8\frac{1}{2}$  years. They will be celebrating the church's  $100^{th}$  Anniversary that Sunday and we have been invited to share in this special service.

My final note is regarding our church staff. Beginning in September, Kat Wagner will be taking over the position of Administrative Assistant for Durham (the secretary role). We are changing the name to help distinguish between the job of the Council Secretary, who will continue to be Ken Anderson, and the parish secretary who produces the weekly bulletins and newsletters. Ken will be training her in September and will continue to be a source of information for Kat as she transitions into the role. I cannot tell you how blessed Durham has been with Ken's work but his intention was always to be a stopgap person, and now we have found whom we believe to be the perfect person to take over. Please take the time to thank Ken for all he has done while serving as secretary and also keep Kat in your prayers as she learns the new job and having to deal with me. I believe we will all be blessed in this transition.

As you can see, things will be hopping around Durham and there is lots to do for all ages. I look forward to the beginning of another school/fall season and believe it will be an exciting one of Durham and the congregations of PALM.

I hope to see you in worship often.
