
CONGREGATIONAL MEETING FEBRUARY 23RD

Pastor's Message:

Dear sisters and brother in Christ,

Please read my entire letter.

Yesterday as I was working on my letter, my attention was caught by the news article about the Episcopal Bishop of Washington, Bishop Mariann Edgar Budde's sermon on Tuesday at the National Cathedral's interfaith Service of Prayer for the Nation. At the end of her sermon, she addressed the President and Vice President with the following statement: "Millions have put their trust in you. And as you told the nation yesterday, you have felt the providential hand of a loving God. In the name of our God, I ask you to have mercy upon the people in our country who are scared now."

In this statement I was reminded of what every disciple of Christ is called to have as a central tenant of faith and life action, that is, to be a people of mercy, grace, forgiveness, empathy and compassion. And I was inspired by her example and reminded of what my job is as a Minister of Word and Sacrament; to proclaim, remind, encourage and exhort that behavior from all who claim to be children of God.

Sadly, the response which Bishop Budde received from the President was anything but Christian. While he has every right to disagree with her, I found his offensive, condescending and degrading comments not only unchristian, but certainly not appropriate from our President. His criticism of her and his call for her to apologize have caused many of his followers to call for her removal from office, her deportation (although she is not an immigrant), and even some threatening of her life. All this has come from our President who says he believes in God, even selling his own "God Bless the USA" Bibles. Yet when it came time to take his oath of office, he wasn't able to put his hand on the Bible.

I'm sure that some of you are very upset with me right now for writing this letter, and that is your right. But I am not writing it to bash the President. I am writing to help us all remember that while we are all now living in the United States of America with Donald Trump as our President, we are more importantly children of God who believe and proclaim that Christ is our King and while we live in this governmental state, our lives are to be lived with a Christ-like character and behavior, guided by the rules of love, compassion and forgiveness exercised by Christ action on the cross for us.

Again let me quote Bishop Budde from her response to this situation on NPR.

"I don't hate the president, and I pray for him," Budde said. "I don't feel there's a need to apologize for a request for mercy. I regret that it was something that has caused the kind of response that it has, in the sense that it actually confirmed the very thing that I was speaking of earlier, which is our tendency to jump to


outrage and not speak to one another with respect," she continued. "But no, I won't, I won't apologize for what I said."

I unapologetically share her feelings and will continue to preach a Gospel of mercy, compassion and forgiveness, fully recognizing that it may indeed cause some to feel I have stepped into a political realm where you don't think I belong. But I do believe that we live in God's kingdom and that all of God's children deserve life, health and human dignity and we should all speak out against any infringement of God's law of love. For me, this will always be first and foremost, one nation under God.

For those of you who are upset with me, please talk to me about it. Complaining to your neighbor about it will not help us move forward. I am more than happy to talk.




