Pastor's Message:

Dear sisters and brothers in Christ,

As the disciples approached Jerusalem, their excitement grew. After three years of living with Jesus, hearing his teachings, and witnessing miracles, they felt the time was right for the new kingdom to arrive. Expectations were high.

On Palm Sunday, events seemed to be unfolding as the disciples had anticipated. The crowds were vocal, chanting "blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord." Palms were being waved, and the atmosphere was energetic. They had had it with the Roman rule, and everyone seemed ready for a change and a new life pattern. Now all they needed was Jesus to claim his rightful place. Or so they thought.

How quickly things changed. Jesus was in the temple everyday teaching and preaching and while he clearly touched the heart and soul of many, he also upset and angered the religious establishment. Add to this the fact that Jesus never made his pitch - to call for ousting the Romans and taking his rightful throne the natives were getting restless. Finally, Judas could wait no longer, he decided to try and force Jesus' hand.

On one hand, Judas' action did not result in Jesus becoming the ruler of Jerusalem as some disciples had hoped. On the other hand, it initiated a sequence of events that led to Jesus' crucifixion, where he was placed on a cross with a crown of thorns rather than a golden crown, and instead of hearing shouts of hosanna, there were cries of "crucify him."

We like the disciples, find ourselves getting more excited as we get closer to Easter. Like the disciples, we get excited about what we think ought to happen at Easter. Easter outfits, egg hunts, parades, Easter bunnies and candy filled baskets are not what Easter is all about. It is about an empty tomb and the amazing, good news that Jesus is risen from the dead. This is a message of hope that we need in a seemingly hopeless world.

As modern-day disciples, our mission is to share and celebrate this unexpected, life-saving news with others. Each April we begin with April Fools' Day. Let us make sure that no one is fooled this April thinking Easter is only about the candy and the costumes. Instead let us focus our efforts on proclaiming the good news and inviting folks to come with you to worship to hear the message and experience the warmth of God's love and blessing.

I look forward to raising my voice with all of yours this Easter so that all in Durham may hear and be made to feel welcome.

PERSONAL CARE KITS

SOME IMPORTANT GUIDELINES TO REMEMBER

- Be sure to shop for light- or medium-weight towels, which are easier for Kit recipients to hand wash and air dry, take up less storage space and are considerably less expensive than the fluffler towels we may prefer to use.
- Bath towels vary in size. The 52" X 27" size listed in the guidelines is the maximum size. 20" x 40" is a good guideline for a minimum size.
- Please give new items only.
- Please do not donate items with any religious symbols, messages or your group's name.
- Please do not donate any items decorated with a U.S. flag, patriotic or military symbols, or references to the armed forces, including camouflage.
- · Do not add other items or leave out any of the items listed.
- · All items should be new and in good condition.
- Do not enclose the Kit or any of its contents in plastic bags.



INCLUDE THE FOLLOWING IN EACH PERSONAL CARE KIT

- ONE light-weight bath-size towel (between 20" x 40" and 52" x 27"), dark color recommended
- TWO or three bath-size bars of soap equaling 8 to 9 oz., any brand, in original wrapping
- ONE adult-size toothbrush in it's original packaging*
- ONE sturdy comb, remove packaging
- ONE metal nail clippers (attached file optional), remove packaging
- * Toothbrush multi-packs may be used by sealing an individual toothbrush in a business-size envelope; no plastic bags or wrap

HOW TO PACK YOUR PERSONAL CARE KITS

- Fold the towel in half. Place the rest of the items in the towel, fold and roll so nothing falls out, and secure with yarn, ribbon, string or rubber bands.
- Pack completed Kits, like items together, in boxes.
 Label contents in LARGE, BLOCK LETTERS on the outside of the boxes.
- Use strong cartons secured with packing tape, not to exceed 40 pounds.
- Do not use plastic or paper bags to pack donations.
- Include the name and address of your group or congregation on each box and label the contents

EUCHARISTIC MINISTER TRAINING


Eucharistic Visitors are members of the congregation who trained to bring the communion meal from worship to ill and homebound members of their congregation who are unable to attend service.







