Pastors Message MAY NEWSLETTER - 2025

Dear sisters and brother in Christ,

As I write this letter, I am reflecting on a meaningful and blessed Holy Week and Easter Day celebration. Additionally, I am recovering from spending three days with my grandchildren, which was enjoyable but not entirely restful. Now that I am back, I look forward to continuing our work here at Durham. Allow me to share several thoughts with you.

Firstly, I wish to convey my appreciation to everyone who contributed to making our Lenten journey, Holy Week pilgrimage, and Easter Celebration a joyous occasion. I would particularly like to express my gratitude to Kat, Carolyn, and Diana (our dedicated staff) for their exceptional service beyond the call of duty. Additionally, I extend my thanks to the choir, altar guild, counters, ushers, greeters, youth helpers, the council, and all others who put forth effort to ensure each event was meaningful.

Secondly, I extend my condolences to Pope Francis and the entire Roman Catholic Church on the passing of the "People's Pope." Pope Francis was a significant advocate for the marginalized, and his influence will be greatly missed. We pray that God's guiding Spirit will be with the Conclave as they select a new Pope.

Third, as you are all aware, a special congregational meeting was held on Palm Sunday to vote on the construction of an Annex building for the church. The meeting was well-attended, and the discussion was thorough, passionate, and encompassed various issues, concerns, hopes, and expectations. Ultimately, the vote resulted in 30 in favor of building a two-story Annex, with the second floor dedicated to Care-a-lot, and 22 opposed. Although I was uncertain about the outcome of the vote, I remain committed to guiding Evangelical Durham forward in ministry. Here are several observations regarding this decision.

- a) It is accurate to state that there were strong emotions regarding the vote. However, we collectively acknowledged that the decision made on April 13, 2025, would have a substantial impact on the future of the Durham Lutheran ministry.
- b) While the majority was evident (57.7%), it was clear that numerous questions, issues, and concerns exist, which I acknowledge as legitimate. A significant number of concerns pertained to the future continuity of the church if approximately 50% of our endowment funds were allocated to constructing the Annex. Despite this concern, the positive aspect is that over one million dollars in endowment funds will remain available for future ministry development after the construction, alongside having an expanded, upgraded facility that facilitates new and expanding ministries within the community.
- c) This point is for those who did not support the addition and may have left the meeting with negative feelings towards the church, its leadership, and me. I acknowledge your dedication to this church, which is why your continued participation in addressing challenges and asking questions is important. Please do not let your dissatisfaction with this vote cause you to disengage from the church. Doing so could contribute to declining involvement. As mentioned on the day of the vote, "if attendance every Sunday matched that of Palm Sunday and Easter, there would be no question regarding the need or feasibility for an addition." I maintain this viewpoint. I encourage you to attend services, engage in the process, and consider taking on leadership roles to support the growth of the church.

d) To maintain openness and transparency, we will provide a monthly update in the newsletter regarding the building process, including responses to any inquiries submitted in the "Question Box" located in the Narthex. The box will remain there for ongoing use. Please note that questions will only be addressed if they are accompanied by the sender's name. Alternatively, you may direct your questions to me or to members of the Council or Building Committee, and we will address them accordingly.

Fourthly, I regret to inform you that two members of the Council, Karen Beerer and Dave Sauter, have resigned. I would like to publicly express our gratitude for their years of dedication and leadership. Consequently, the Council will be seeking to fill these two unexpired terms. I request that you pray for the Council during this search and consider accepting one of these leadership roles if approached. Strong leadership is essential for our congregation as we continue to advance in ministry together.

Fifth, I'd like to remind you that Sunday, May 4th will be our second PALM Pulpit Exchange, following the event held last November. While I cannot disclose the name of the visitor, I can confirm that it will not be myself nor Pastor Caron, who was present in November. Therefore, it will either be Pastor Bergen, Pastor Gow, or Pastor Harkness. We hope to have a full church to extend a warm welcome to our guest.

Finally, building a brick-and-mortar structure is only half the task. The other crucial part is determining which ministries will open in Durham with the new facility, especially with a new pastoral guide. In June, I will be halfway through my three-year contract, and it's time for serious discussions about what will happen starting in 2027. I will recommend that the Council establish a new call committee in the fall to address this matter.

As you can see things may take a pause, but there is still much work to be done. I continue to look forward to working with you on this glorious endeavor.

- Diapers, pull-ups, and diaper wipes






Christian Education

PERSONAL CARE KITS

SOME IMPORTANT GUIDELINES TO REMEMBER

- Be sure to shop for light- or medium-weight towels, which are easier for Kit recipients to hand wash and air dry, take up less storage space and are considerably less expensive than the fluffler towels we may prefer to use.
- Bath towels vary in size. The 52" X 27" size listed in the guidelines is the maximum size. 20" x 40" is a good guideline for a minimum size.
- · Please give new items only.
- Please do not donate items with any religious symbols, messages or your group's name.
- Please do not donate any items decorated with a U.S. flag, patriotic or military symbols, or references to the armed forces, including camouflage.
- · Do not add other items or leave out any of the items listed.
- · All items should be new and in good condition.
- · Do not enclose the Kit or any of its contents in plastic bags.

INCLUDE THE FOLLOWING IN EACH PERSONAL CARE KIT

- ONE light-weight bath-size towel (between 20" x 40" and 52" x 27"), dark color recommended
- TW0 or three bath-size bars of soap equaling 8 to 9 oz., any brand, in original wrapping
- ONE adult-size toothbrush in it's original packaging*
- ONE sturdy comb, remove packaging
- ONE metal nail clippers (attached file optional), remove packaging
- * Toothbrush multi-packs may be used by sealing an individual toothbrush in a business-size envelope; no plastic bags or wrap

HOW TO PACK YOUR PERSONAL CARE KITS

- Fold the towel in half. Place the rest of the items in the towel, fold and roll so nothing falls out, and secure with yarn, ribbon, string or rubber bands.
- Pack completed Kits, like items together, in boxes.
 Label contents in LARGE, BLOCK LETTERS on the outside of the boxes.



PALM: Palisades Area Lutheran Ministries



The PALM group continues to be active. The six churches involved are Christ Lutheran in Pipersville, Evangelical Lutheran Church of Durham, St. Luke's Lutheran in Ferndale, St. Peter's Lutheran in Riegelsville, Trinity Evangelical Lutheran Church in Coopersburg and Upper Tinicum Lutheran in Upper Tinicum.

For several years, there have been shared activities between some members of the PALM congregations including Crop Walk, Lenton services, Live Nativity Program, Confirmation Classes and Vacation Bible School. In 2024, each of the PALM congregational leaders started to look at what more our PALM group could do in order to help all the congregations grow while serving the PALM community in a better way....how can we come together in a way to share resources in a more formalized structure that will help us to share God's Word. mission and outreach for the entire PALM community.

What have we done so far? The council leaders of all the PALM group (PALM Leaders) have been meeting on a regular basis to brainstorm options of becoming a PALM Parish. Committees were formed from this team that include Mission Statement, Program/Activities, Rostered Staff, Administrative Staff, Finance and Communication. Each team has met separately to focus on their specific areas and brainstorm how we can work together as a parish in the future by sharing resources while also keeping existing congregations, buildings and any traditions that the individual congregations want to maintain. Our goal is not to close congregations but to strengthen our ministry in the community.

What are the next steps? We will continue to meet on a regular basis and will work as a team to also gather feedback from all the members of the PALM community church. This is a process that does take time, but we are all committed to gathering all PALM members' input as to what a future PALM parish could look like.
