Pastor's Message November 2025

Dear Durham Church Family,

I would like to begin by acknowledging this anniversary. Four years ago, I assumed the role of worship leader at Durham following Pastor Deal's retirement. At that time, it was anticipated that a new pastor would be called and I would transition to retirement, serving only as needed on Sundays. However, circumstances have unfolded differently, and now, four years later, we continue our shared mission—preaching the Gospel of Jesus Christ and working to proclaim this good news throughout the Durham community.

While I have grown to care deeply for each of you and truly enjoyed our time working together, I recognize that Durham Lutheran's ministry must move forward with new pastoral leadership, which means my tenure here is coming to a close. The upcoming 13 months are vital for determining your ministry's future path, and it will require the full involvement of everyone in the congregation to ensure a smooth transition and a vibrant beginning to your next chapter.

Although the council will be responsible for most of the initial tasks, it is essential to foster an environment of support and encouragement. Prospective pastors assess various factors when considering joining a congregation; however, one consistently influential aspect is the average weekly worship attendance and overall experience. In today's digital landscape, candidates can easily review our services online at any time. A worship setting with only a few visible attendees does not create a favorable impression. Therefore, I recommend that all members consider sitting closer to the front of the church to ensure visibility on camera. Presenting a consistently well-attended service enhances the appeal of our congregation.

Other factors are also considered by prospective candidates when reviewing your documentation. One such factor is the budget, as well as the extent of congregational support for that budget. Typically, pastors prefer to serve in churches where financial contributions are stable or increasing. Unfortunately, to date in 2025, our giving has fallen short of 2024 levels by several thousand dollars. This negative trend may not inspire confidence in potential candidates.

An additional area to highlight as a strength is lay leadership. Although we are fortunate to have several dedicated lay leaders, there remains a need for greater participation. Currently, our council is operating with one fewer member than stipulated by our constitution, resulting in an increased workload for existing members. However, leadership extends beyond council service; it encompasses volunteering in various capacities, such as greeting on Sunday mornings, ushering, assisting with communion, singing in the choir, serving as a lector, or inviting others to participate in worship. I encourage all individuals to consider identifying at least one new way in which they can contribute to the continued support and growth of ministry at Durham.

As we enter the month of November and reflect on Thanksgiving, I would like to express my sincere gratitude for the opportunity to participate in worship at Durham. I am committed to working alongside you in the coming year as we prepare for this significant transition toward a promising future. Let us pray for the Spirit's guidance during our time together.

One of the facts the writer shared was that more than 2,000 Bible passages refer to money and possessions; the word prayer is mentioned only 254 times. We obviously need to be cautioned not to love money more than God. Our next discussion will deal with stewardship – how do we tend to our treasure.


