Pastor's Message December 2025

Greetings sisters and brothers in Christ,

Wishing you a Blessed Christmas and a Happy New Year. This greeting is intentional, although this article appears in the December newsletter rather than in January. Within the Christian tradition, there are in fact two occasions to mark the new year. In addition to celebrating the turn of the calendar year on January 1st, Christians also observe the beginning of the liturgical year, which commences with Advent. The start date for the liturgical year varies slightly, but it consistently occurs four weeks prior to Christmas; this year, Advent begins on Sunday, November 30th. Much like the astronomical new year, the liturgical new year offers an opportunity for renewal, grace, and hope, as well as a chance to move beyond the difficulties and struggles of the past year. For us as a family of God, this new year will also bring about a year of significant change, most of which I believe will be positive in nature.

The initial major development will be the construction of the Annex. At the time of writing, all necessary variances and approvals from the Township have been secured, allowing us to proceed with the project. In December, we will invite bids from four builders. By mid-January, these bids will be reviewed by the building committee, which will then make a recommendation to the council regarding the preferred contractor. Upon council approval, the selected General Contractor will apply for building permits and establish a groundbreaking date, anticipated for the spring. The construction phase is expected to take six to nine months, with a projected move-in date by the end of 2026. Monthly updates will be provided to the congregation through both the newsletter and the Durham Dialogue meetings, held on the fourth Sunday of each month following the service.

Another significant development is the ongoing search for a new pastor. This process has already commenced, with the council meeting Pastor Bill Colman, the Conference Dean, to discuss the necessary steps. A dedicated subcommittee has been formed to update the Mission Site Profile (MSP), which will be submitted to the Synod for posting to attract potential candidates. Both the committee and the council are eager to hear from all members of the congregation regarding the qualities, skills, and gifts you believe are essential in your next pastor.

The first opportunity for input will be on Sunday, December 7th. After the Congregational Budget Meeting, there will be the traditional WELCA-hosted Christmas Pot Luck luncheon, during which the Council will be soliciting feedback from attendees. The aim is to submit the updated MSP to the Synod early in 2026, at which point Durham will officially be listed as vacant and seeking a new pastor.

While it is possible that an interested candidate may come forward quickly, the current shortage of pastors means that the process could take months. Please rest assured that should a suitable candidate become available prior to January 1, 2027, I am prepared to step down. Nevertheless, I remain committed to fulfilling my promise to see the building project through to completion as necessary.

Both of these developments represent positive progress for our community. Over the past four years, we have collectively worked to maintain stability and strength within Evangelical Durham, while establishing a solid foundation for future growth. The new annex will offer modernized office and bathroom facilities, expanded meeting areas, and a dedicated space for Care-a-lot. I am confident that the congregation is prepared to welcome its next pastor, who will guide you into the upcoming phase of ministry. You are a committed, generous, and joyful group, well positioned to collaborate effectively with your new shepherd in fulfilling your mission. It is anticipated that the new pastor will bring renewed energy, vision, enthusiasm, and a sincere dedication to serving in this role.

Although change isn't always easy for us Lutherans, it's unavoidable. As we approach another new year together, the changes ahead feel exciting and geared towards progress, all while remaining true to Durham Lutheran's long-standing vision and mission. I am eager to move forward with you each Sunday, experiencing both the ups and downs, confident that we are never alone—God is with us!
